The responsibility of this committee is to manage the collection, compilation, and submission of stories or professional narratives (including professional journal-type submissions) for publication that reflect the experience or research of members and non-members about using story in organizational work. Actual publication of the stories and announcements of them will be handled by other appropriate committees.

The Formats Used by this Committee Include:

- White papers (professional journal-type submissions);
- Interviews (conducted and compiled by committee co-chairs); and
- Professional narratives (accounts submitted by NSN and non-NSN members describing ways they’ve successfully used storytelling in organizations).

The Roles of this Committee Are to:

- Inform;
- Showcase successful approaches and interventions;
- Create a collection of narratives that illustrate applied storytelling;
- Provide exposure opportunities for practitioners and researchers;
- Stimulate inquiry, innovation, and dialogue;
- Bring SIO SIG community together around shared exploration; and
- Produce a body of knowledge that may lead to mainstream publication.

The Specific Duties of this Committee Are to:

- Keep the guidelines current;
- Promote the concept of “Stories from the Field;”
- Seek authors;
- Apply the guidelines in the collection of stories (narratives and journal-type submissions);
- Interview authors who prefer to be interviewed rather than write their own stories;
- Review submissions to assure they comply with the guidelines; and
- Submit completed stories with draft announcement and biographical information to the newsletter and the website committees.
